CPR and use of an AED are basic life saving skills for everyone. Through instructor led discussion, hands-on application, and video presentation, students will learn the proper response skills for emergency scene assessment, choking assistance, unconscious victim resuscitation, cardiac arrest, and stroke.

### Implementation Mechanism

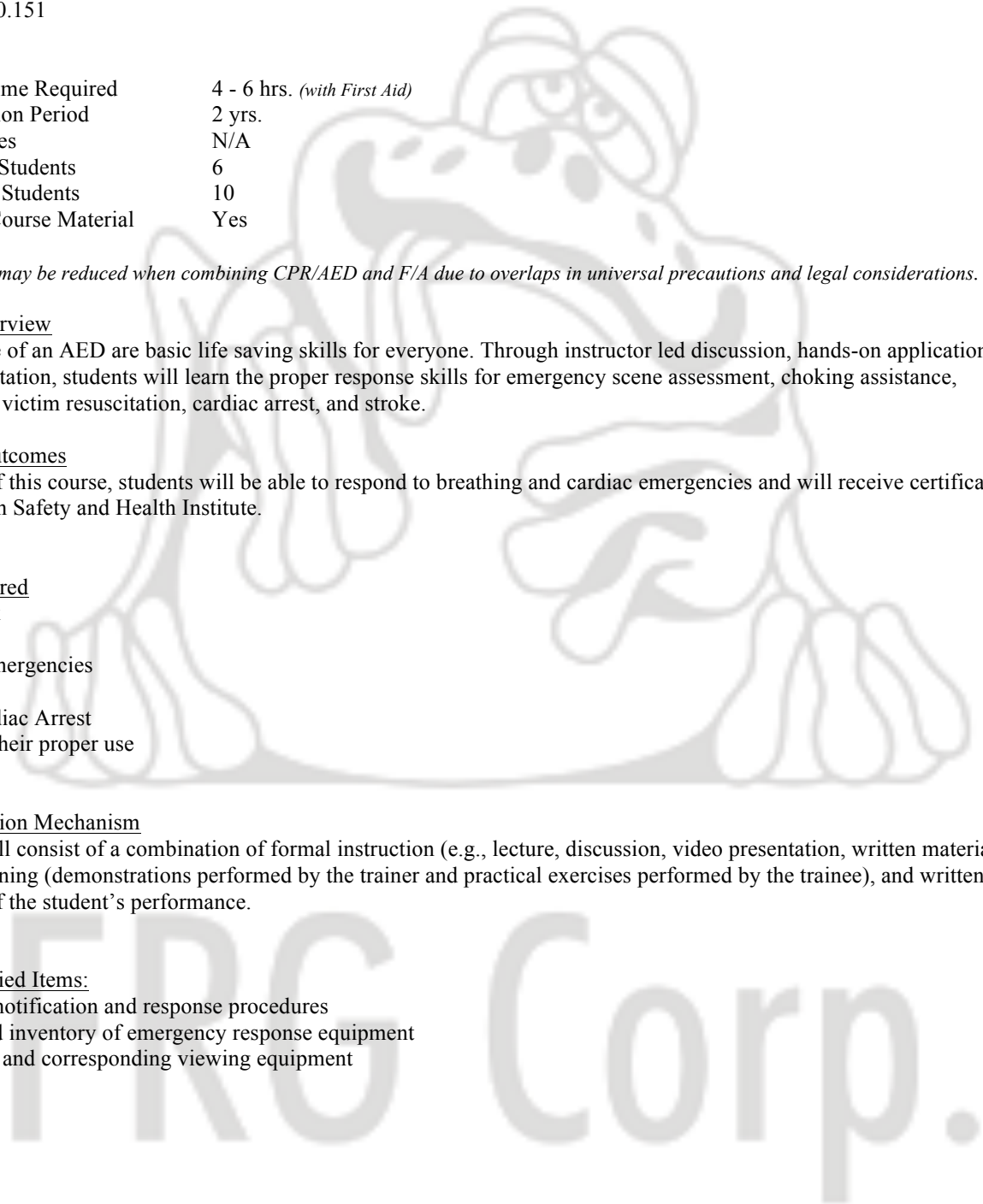
